

SPECIALIZATION IN ANTHROPOLOGY AND HONOURS SPECIALIZATION IN ANTHROPOLOGY

Admission Requirements:

Honours: Completion of first-year requirements with no failing grades. Students must have a minimum average of 70% in 3.0 principal courses including 1.0 from: Anthropology 1020 (formerly 1020E) OR one of 1021A/B or 1025F/G combined with one of 1022A/B, 1026F/G, or 1027A/B with a minimum mark of 60% in each.

Non-honors: Completion of first-year requirements 1.0 from: Anthropology 1020 (formerly 1020E) OR one of 1021A/B or 1025F/G combined with one of 1022A/B, 1026F/G or 1027A/B with a minimum mark of 60% in each.

Note: Students interested in taking courses in linguistic anthropology in section (c) below should take 1027A/B. All other students should take either 1022A/B or 1026F/G.

** Note: ANTH 3350F and 3351G should be taken in Year 3 and 4401F in Year 4.*

c) 1.0 course:

- Linguistics 2248A/B Syntactic Analysis

** Note: Students interested in taking Linguistic Anthropology should take LING 2247A/B and 2248A/B. All other students should take Anth 2226A/B and 2229F/G.*
